

The **Severe Asthma Patient Review Service** is a non-promotional medical service provided through a Donations of Goods and Services (“DOGS”)* agreement between GlaxoSmithKline UK Limited (GSK) and the NHS.

A team of Respiratory Nurse Specialists or appropriately trained clinical pharmacists deliver the service in specialist asthma centres, or in their secondary care spoke sites where an established need has been identified and a request made for support with the initial assessment and/or ongoing review of patients with severe asthma. The nurses and pharmacists are employed by CHASE Search and Selection Ltd (a third-party supplier) and funded by GSK.

***Donations of Goods and Services (DOGS)** are “funds, benefits-in-kind or services freely given for the purpose of supporting healthcare, scientific research or education, with no consequent obligation on the recipient organisation, institution and the like to provide goods or services to the benefit of the pharmaceutical company in return. Donations and grants to individuals are prohibited”¹.
