Asthma New Zealand

Asthma NZ is a not-for-profit organisation committed to creating a healthier NZ, providing asthma education to reduce hospitalisation and improve the way New Zealanders live with asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).

We have supported this group since 2022.

During 2022:

GSK provided \$6,950.10 NZD of funding to support Asthma NZ to deliver a Nurse Education in Asthma Treatment 1-day workshop for 100 Mana School Nurses and Whanau Support Workers. The workshop runs from 9.30 am – 4 pm and on completion 100 school nurses and whanau support workers will have considerably more confidence to identify, provide education and support thousands of children across South Auckland. The workshop covers: Asthma identification, triggers, medication, peak flow, self-management, emergency plans and device use (practical application).

Our support represented 0.72% of their overall income in 2022.

Talk Peach Gynaecological Cancer Foundation

Talk Peach Gynaecological Cancer Foundation educate the public on the early and often subtle signs of gynaecological cancers. They empower people to advocate for their health, helping those who have been diagnosed, to ask the right questions, and advocate for themselves if they aren't being listened to.

We have supported this group since 2022.

During 2022:

GSK provided a grant of \$8,955 for an Ovarian Cancer Support Guide - Ovarian cancer can be a difficult journey, it is imperative that those diagnosed have all the information and support they need at their fingertips. At present New Zealand does not yet have a support guide for those diagnosed with ovarian cancer. This guide will assist those diagnosed in processing the news, support them through the challenges ahead and empower them to ask questions, build support, and advocate for their health. The guide will be printed and distributed to District Health Board Gynaecology Oncology departments In Auckland, Wellington and Christchurch. The guide has been written and designed and is ready to print and distribute.

Our support represented 19.4% of their overall income in 2022.

Cure Our Ovarian Cancer (Low GSerous) Charitable Trust

Cure Our Ovarian Cancer's mission is to help women with ovarian cancer live better, longer lives. They are the only dedicated ovarian cancer charity in Aotearoa. Within NZ they work with patients, health practitioners and researchers to improve ovarian cancer outcomes by targeting awareness and education, support, advocacy and research.

We have supported this group since 2022.

During 2022:

GSK provided \$8,100 NZD of funding to support a virtual support group for New Zealanders with Ovarian Cancer. To help New Zealand women with ovarian cancer to feel connected, supported and part of a community where they have a voice. Currently New Zealand women have no access to ovarian cancer specific support, aside from a patient led facebook forum. They struggle to connect with others with a lived experience of their cancer. It is not uncommon for them to have been referred to Google to source information or find others. Women commonly experience isolation.

Our support represented 2.4% of their overall income in 2022.
