The mission of CoMO is to assist its members to be sustainable, identifiable and influential sources for information and support services for those people affected by meningitis in their countries and regions while being united globally in their endeavours through their membership of CoMO.

We have worked with this organisation since 2010.

During 2018:

- We provided £12,000 for CoMO's World Meningitis Day 2018, used to create a toolkit of resources for World Meningitis Day.
- We provided £37,000 for CoMO's Global Conference 2018, used to enable CoMO members to attend the conference in Singapore to learn new skills, share their experiences and develop a stronger meningitis network.

Our support represented 49% of their overall income.

During 2017:

We provided £12,224 for COMO's World Meningitis Campaign materials

Our support represents 7% of their overall income.

During 2016:

- We provided £31,000 for COMO's World Meningitis campaign materials.
- We provided \$40,000 as a restricted grant for the day to day running of their organisation.

Our support represents 25% of their overall income.

During 2015:

- We provided an unrestricted grant of \$80,000 to support the group in delivering its objectives.
- We provided \$24,000 to support COMO's member's conference September 2015 in Seattle, Washington State, USA.

Our support represents 22.5% of their overall income.

During 2014:

 We provided an unrestricted grant of \$80,000 to support the group in delivering its objectives.

Our support represents 41% of their overall income.



During 2013:

• We gave an unrestricted grant of \$80,000 to help them with their activities.

Our support represents 28% of their overall income.

During 2012:

• We gave an unrestricted grant of \$80,000 to help them with their activities.

Our support represents 16% of their overall income.

During 2011:

• We gave an unrestricted grant of \$80,000 to help them with their activities.

Our support represents 21% of their overall income.
