Association of Bulgarians with Asthma (ABBA)

The Association of Bulgarians with asthma was founded in 2002. It is a national non-profit association for patients suffering from bronchial asthma and other chronic pulmonary diseases.

The Association of Bulgarians with asthma offers numerous initiatives for assistance. As the causes of the disease are numerous, it is important to: individual consultations; upholding your right to healthcare according to European and world standards; ensuring your access to effective modern forms of diagnosis, treatment and prevention; providing up-to-date health and medical information

In 2019, GlaxoSmithKline EOOD donated to ABBA:

- BGN 10,000 / ten thousand BGN / to support the implementation of World Asthma Day events.

The funding that GlaxoSmithKline EOOD provided to ABBA in 2019 is below 25% of the organization's total annual funding.

Pulmonary Hypertension Association

Pulmonary Hypertension Association Bulgaria is a non-profit organization whose activity is to support people suffering from rare pulmonary / pulmonary / hypertension disease, to assist in communication between them and government institutions and to protect the rights of patients with this diagnosis and originate concomitant diseases.

The mission of the association is: protection of the rights of patients diagnosed with pulmonary hypertension, its origin and concomitant diseases; supporting, bringing together, encouraging and informing people with the disease and adapting them to society; supporting the professional development and qualification of researchers and medics in the field of prevention, diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation of the disease; acquainting the society with the peculiarities of the disease, its prevention, diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation, its physiological and psychological consequences; taking measures to overcome the emotional consequences of the disease; vocational retraining and social rehabilitation of people with the disease; providing funds for the treatment and support of patients with the rare disease primary pulmonary hypertension in Bulgaria and abroad; promotion, support and development of disease research in Bulgaria and abroad; establishing contacts with similar organizations at home and abroad.

In 2019, GlaxoSmithKline EOOD donated:

- BGN 10 000 to the Pulmonary Hypertension Association. / ten thousand BGN / for organizing and holding the Eighth National Conference on Pulmonary Hypertension for Patients.

Bulgarian Society for Patients with Pulmonary Hypertension

Association "Bulgarian Society for Patients with of Pulmonary Hypertension" is an organization that fully understands the challenges faced by patients and their relatives. To this end, they seek to promote patient contact and empathy, as well as to adapt them to their changed lifestyles.

In 2019 GlaxoSmithKline EOOD donated: to the Bulgarian Society of Patients with Pulmonary Hypertension BGN 7,408 / seven thousand four hundred and eight BGN / for the following activities:

- BGN 6908 (six thousand nine hundred and eight BGN) for the Women and Pulmonary Hypertension project and

National Alliance of People with Rare Diseases

In 2007, the National Alliance of People with Rare Diseases (NAHRB) was established in Bulgaria. The National Alliance of People with Rare Diseases (NAHRB) is a non-governmental organization dedicated to the problems of people with rare diseases.

The Alliance was created in 2007 by representatives of 8 diseases to protect their rights and to help improve their prevention, diagnosis, treatment, rehabilitation and quality of life.

As of the end of 2013, the NAHRB is engaged in the problems of 53 diseases.

Through its activities, it seeks to raise public awareness of the needs of people with rare diseases. Interaction with legislative and health care institutions is aimed at providing adequate and equal treatment and care for patients.

In 2019 GlaxoSmithKline EOOD donated BGN 16 600 (sixteen thousand six hundred BGN) to the National Alliance of People with Rare Diseases (NAHRB) to support the following projects and activities:

- BGN 10,000 / ten thousand BGN / for organizing activities to mark World Rare Disease Day
- BGN 1 600 / one thousand six hundred BGN / for the participation of two representatives of the patient organization of the World Conference on Rare Diseases and Orphan Drugs, as well as the annual meeting of the EURORDIS patient organizations.
- BGN 5,000 (BGN 5,000) for organizing and holding an annual meeting of the National Alliance of People with Rare Diseases on 14-15.12.2019 in Sofia

National Patient Organisation

National Patient Organization was established in January 2010 as an association of legal entities - patient organizations. A national patient organization was created to unite the patient voice and to represent and protect the interests of all patients. The main objectives of NPO are: development and promotion of civic participation in the management and control of the health system; introduction of the principle of equal trilateral partnership between state bodies, medical professional organizations, patient associations in the formulation and adoption of strategies, criteria and norms, introduction of policies and practices in the healthcare system; involving patients' representatives in the management of structures in the healthcare system; development, implementation and validation of ethical rules and rules in the work of patient organizations, as well as their interaction with institutions, media and society.

In 2019 GlaxoSmithKline EOOD donated BGN 40,000 (forty thousand levs) to the National Patient Organization to support the following projects and activities:

- BGN 10,000 / ten thousand BGN / core funding
- 20,000 BGN / twenty thousand BGN / to organize the PACT Conference "The Future of Health - Progress of the United Nations Sustainable Development Program 2030 in Europe" in Brussels
- BGN 10,000 / ten thousand BGN / to support the organization of the Eighth National Congress of Patient Organizations

National Association for the Prevention of Cervical Cancer

The aim of the Association is to promote the prevention of cervical cancer among young women. The activity of the Organization is focused mainly on healthy people - unaffected by the disease. The goal is to inform about the disease cervical cancer and ways to prevent it.

In 2019, GlaxoSmithKline EOOD donated:

- BGN 7,000 (seven thousand BGN) to the National Association for the Prevention of Cervical Cancer to help organize and hold informative meetings with parents on the topic of HPV.

The funding that GlaxoSmithKline EOOD provided to the National Cervical Cancer Prevention Association in 2019 represents less than 25% of the organization's total annual funding.

The organization of patients with rheumatological diseases in Bulgaria

The organization of patients with rheumatological diseases in Bulgaria (OPRBB) was established in 2010. The main purpose of the association is to support the people suffering from such diseases and to receive modern treatment to ensure a better life.

OPRZB is the only organization of its kind in Bulgaria.

At this stage, its main activity is to conduct seminars and events to raise awareness among patients and the public about the problems faced by people with rheumatic diseases; holding round tables and press conferences on major issues related to access to treatment, rehabilitation and social integration of people with rheumatic diseases in Bulgaria.

In 2019 GlaxoSmithKline Ltd. Donated:

- BGN 4,500 (four thousand five hundred BGN) to OPRZB for organizing a discussion on the problems that people with lupus in Bulgaria face as part of the Rheumatic Disease Awareness Week campaign.

The funding that GlaxoSmithCline Bulgaria provided to OPRZB in 2019 represents less than 25% of the organization's total annual funding.

Federation Bulgarian Patient Forum

The Federation of Bulgarian Patient Forum is registered as a non-governmental organization for the public benefit. The object of the organization is to protect the rights of citizens in the field of health care and to provide national representation of patients and patient organizations.

In 2019 GlaxoSmithKline EOOD donated BGN 20,000 (BGN 20,000) to the Federation of Bulgarian Patient Forum to support the following projects and activities:

- BGN 6,000 / six thousand BGN / to support the organization of the VIII National FBFF Forum
- BGN 8,000 (eight thousand BGN) for the organization of the Autumn Patient Academy on September 27-29, 2019.
- BGN 6,000 / six thousand BGN / to support the organization of the annual journalism awards "Daniela Seizova - In the name of life"

I Foundation

I Foundation was founded in 2004. It is the successor of the Plus and Minus Foundation, established in 1999 as a continuation of the activity of a group formed in 1997 to provide assistance only to people living with HIV in Varna. The foundation engages like-minded people who are committed to and committed to the problems of people living with HIV.

I Foundation works to protect the human, civil and patient rights of people living with HIV. The priority objective and area of activity of the Foundation is to provide universal access to the most up-to-date antiretroviral treatment in the country and related complex medical care. Providing accessible information on the subject is an integral part of achieving this goal.

In this regard, the Foundation specializes in: 1) publishing patient training materials covering a wide variety of aspects of the disease and life with it 2) maintaining a website providing information in Bulgarian on HIV / AIDS - www.aidsbg.info, with main thematic focus on the treatment of HIV and life with HIV.

In 2019, GlaxoSmithCline EOOD donated:

- BGN 30,000 (thirty thousand BGN) to a I Foundation for supporting the renovation of the Foundation's website and the provision of patient training materials.
