COPD Support Ireland is a charity set up to support all those living with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), a lung condition that makes it hard for sufferers to breathe due to obstruction of the airways in their lungs. It is Ireland's first national COPD support and advocacy body, bringing together local support groups from around the country, to help those living with, or caring for someone with, COPD.

We have supported this group for over seven years.

During 2019:

- GSK provided a project grant of €15,000 to support World COPD Day 2019 activities. Also, GSK provided a project grant of €5,000 to support the National Co-ordination of COPD Support Groups in 2019.

Our support represented 12.33% of their overall income.

During 2018:

- GSK provided a project grant of €10,000 to support World COPD Day 2018 activities and a benefit in kind support of €4,500 for Winter Wellness Campaign in November. Also, GSK provided a core funding of €10,000 in form of general support for 2017 and additional a core funding of €10,000 in form of general support for 2018.

Our support represented just under 21% of their overall income.

Epilepsy Ireland provides a range of support services from headquarters in Dublin and from regional offices in Cork, Dundalk, Galway, Kerry, Kilkenny, Letterkenny, Limerick, Sligo and Tullamore. The charity also works to improve epilepsy awareness, supports Irish epilepsy research, provides training and education programmes and advocates on behalf of those living with the condition.
